Message for the Fifth Sunday of Lent.

The word "hypocrite" comes from the Greek language, in which the Gospels were mostly written. It means an actor, or literally, "one who wears a mask."

Where hypocrisy is mentioned in the Gospels, it usually refers to a person who hides behind a mask of respectability whilst their true nature is corrupt.

In today's Gospel reading, the Scribes and Pharisees think that they have put Jesus in an impossible dilemma. If he pardons the sinner, he will be rejecting the demands of the Law, and if he condemns her, he will be seen to be callous. Instead, he confronts them with their own hypocrisy, "If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her."

No human being is qualified to do so. All are sinners.

Ukrainian Refugees Update. On 28th I attended a Caritas Zoom meeting where we were presented with information about and discussed how the Catholic community might help any refugees arriving from Ukraine. The first point that came out is that the donations of clothes, medicines etc, were most welcome but if you want to offer further assistance, the best way to do it is by making a financial donation via the Disasters Emergency Committee appeal for Ukraine. This is because goods have to be stored, transported, stored again and then distributed which is costly and time consuming. The second point is that most refugees will probably try and stay in Eastern Europe because it will be easier to return home from there once the fighting finishes. Any that come to the UK will come probably because they already have relatives/friends in the UK. To my knowledge there are three families in the parish who have offered to host Ukrainian refugees. It was suggested that if any refugees do arrive in our parish it would be good to think that the parish would step up and offer support to these refugees. Finally, if anyone else in the parish has registered to offer accommodation to a refugee, I would be grateful if they would contact me. 01509 233753. Thank you from Frank Fay
